1 0.32%	As one in the older age group, I believe there needs to be more time in cleaning the campus, getting things in place without rushing and ensuring the workers and the students that ALL has been done to make sure I don't get sick. Woring remotely has allowed me to restrict who comes in my space and that's the control I would prefer

1 0.32%	By no fault of their own, both in number and supplies, the housekeeping staff would not be able to keep up with the amount of cleaning and sterilization necessary to combat spread of COVID 19. Particularly since some buildings are starting at a deficit.
1 0.32%	Clueless to the illnesses students, visitors and other staff may unknowingly or non-verbally carry, I am very concerned about COVID exposure given the HIGH volume of human interactions required. Even when desired, many are still unable to safely protect others or self quarantine based on crowded, homeless, or unhealthy daily living conditions. Historic Jenkins mold and asbestos mixed with the Coronavirus makes for a very unhealthy petri dish of germs spreading through the air ventilation system. I am concerned about students, faculty, guests and administrators who may opt NOT to wear the recommended mask periodically and spread COVID. Given my recent virtual experience helping students cope since transitioning from campus after Spring break, I anticipate spending significantly more time consoling and referring anxious campus students (families) for MSU Mental Counseling or Health Center services versus resolving other enrollment generated needs.
1 0.32%	Concern about the consistency of cleaning and sanitation protocols; Unsure of protocols to maintain safety of faculty, students, and especially vulnerable staff and faculty.
1 0.32%	Concerned about cleanliness of buildings.
1 0.32%	Concerned about the cleaning of the office spaces, doors, door knobs, desks, etc,
1 0.32%	Concerns regarding people who may or may not be aware that they are sick and show no symptoms such as temperature.
1 0.32%	COVID is still a large, ongoing issue and even with restricts being lifted and protocols in place, I do not feel comfortable in environments of other people until a vaccine for the virus is available
1 0.32%	COVID-19 is a highly transmissible and potentially deadly virus. Young people are less likely to take the virus seriously, practice social distancing and properly use PPE. Morgan State University does not have the resources to enforce these measures all across campus and the dorms effectively, nor is it reasonable to expect that all the facilities and surfaces can be sanitized many times throughout the day. The quality of classroom instruction will also be severely negatively impacted under social distancing measures, making it difficult to hear one another through masks or interact through plexiglass barriers. The active learning pedagogy that best serves our students will be impossible under these circumstances. The majority of faculty in my division have reported that they find the quality of online instruction to be as good or better than face-to-face instruction, even without social distancing. I also

	have an underlying respiratory condition that puts me at a higher risk of dying from COVID-19.
1 0.32%	COVID-19 is highly contagious. The facilities and buildings we work in do not support or allow for proper social distancing when you factor in the quantity of people who will be on campus. Even when I am forced to be on campus, social distancing guidelines are not always practiced by those on campus. I am also not confident that enough PPE and cleaning supplies will be available to everyone on campus. When requests were made for cleaning supplies, we were told that none was available to provide to departments who had to continue functioning on campus.
1 0.32%	Current cleaning practices are questionable. Our spaces are very public and I cannot put my staff and constituencies at risk. Also objects and artifacts cannot sustain the chemicals.
1 0.32%	Currently, I work in the Jenkins on the quad building, and with the building being in the condition it is currently in. It is my personal opinion that this building will not be cleaned properly, and social distancing will not take place.
1 0.32%	Depends on the level and frequency of "cleaning" and the enforcement of colleagues compliance with safety protocols.
1 0.32%	Depends on the physical environment, especially older buildings. Non LEED-certified structures with poor HVAC equipment and circulation can harbor airborne pathogens, Truth Hall being one, which resulted in several departments fleeing the scene rather than risking employee illness and decreased productivity, yet impacting morale for those remaining.
1 0.32%	Do we have to wear mask while sitting and doing our work? If so, I wouldn't be to wear my mask all day. The mask makes me feel hot after an hour.
1 0.32%	Dr. Wilson, during the Covid 19 stay at home mandate I've personally experienced some health challenges. I've been privleged to work from home and due to my health challenges I would like to continue. The building where I am has no windows. I believe staff who are able to work from home should be given that option. I believe it's a safer approach to limiting exposure for everyone.
1 0.32%	Due the nature of my position and the requirement to always be in contact with people, I do not feel safe.
1 0.32%	Due to the current protest going on in the USA, the COVID-19 is going to come back harder than ever.
1 0.32%	Due to underlying health conditions and as the caretaker for a parent with a severely compromised immune system I would never wish to make her sick.
1 0.32%	Even with "protocols in place" we would still be placed at risk not just on campus but in commuting to and from (e.g. on the bus)
1 0.32%	Even with people required to wear masks, the practice social distancing and extra cleaning, will the university be able to consistently enforce the rules? Maybe tall plexiglass partitions could be installed in front of desks [of faculty, staff, administrators, etc.[as an added preventative measure. I believe that many employees fall into the vulnerable category, i.e. being 60 or older and having underlying conditions. A combination of teleworking and on-campus working would be best whenever possible.
1 0.32%	Everyone will not follow the rules or guidelines that Morgan or the State set, therefore I'm saying I'm not sure whether or not that I'll be or feel comfortable. So far none of the bldgs that I'm aware of have yet to be thoroughly cleaned by a outside source (Leaning Co.), and the filtration throughout the campus bldgs. As of today all bldgs need to be checked by an outside source for proper air quality before re-entering these bldgs.
1 0.32%	Expected departmental move to a new facility and absolutely no idea of the physical space also over the age of 65. I would feel comfortable working in my current facility with no face to face meetings. Can not honestly answer for the fall, it depends on the COVID 19 containment at the time. There are also concerns regarding the quality of testing results if administered.
1 0.32%	Firstly, Due to my health condition, i cant avoid to take risk. Second,our work place environment is not hygienic enough, thirdly, is it going to be very uncomfortable to wear mask all day.

1 0.32%	From what I am currently seeing people are not practicing social distancing and I just don't believe it will be followed as well as the younger generation seems to not be taking this as seriously as they should which will put staff at risk.
1 0.32%	Getting the campus "Covid ready" is an enormous task. European and Asian cities are disinfecting sidewalks and buildings, while Washington's misleadership is recommending Lysol injections. I think a *thorough* plan for social distancing, resident hall living, dining, classroom instruction should be worked out, presented to the staff and then implemented. Perhaps fall semester would be better used getting the campus ready and for now continue to teach via Canvas. No campus wants to be the first in the U.S. to report a COVID death of a student because it opened up to early.

1 0.329	6	Given we are an educational institution, plus the fact that I have a very high-traffic shared office, it would be hard to control my contact with others. I also teach sections of a course in which more than 30 students are enrolled at any given time. I have also observed the behavior of others when I am at the grocery store or similar essential needs establishments. Not everyone adheres to the guidelines. I believe we may see similar on and around the campus.

1 0.329	6	I am a high risk employee with a compromises immune system. I share an office, I would be more comfortable in a space of my own if possible.
1 0.329	6	I am a member of a vulnerable group and would prefer teleworking or, if necessary, only coming to campus one or two days a week.
1 0.329	6	I am a member of the higher risk group, thus I am very nervous about our return without additional data and testing.
1 0.329	6	I am a person with a preexisting condition and I would feel comfortable with office with a window which will allow me to communicate with students, faculty and staff without them having to enter the office. The window is already in place. I would like to have it converted with an opening for mail which will also suffice for verbal communication. Our students, faculty and staff travel from all over the world and we have no way of knowing who is carring the virus.
1 0.329	6	I am an older person with some health issues and my concern would be virus testing and contact tracing/
1 0.329	6	I am concerned about folks following this protocol, and how the university plans to enforce it. If there is no plan to enforce it, I will not feel safe.
1 0.329	6	I am concerned about the university's ability to sanitize spaces thoroughly and frequently, particularly those in high traffic areas. I am also concerned about the university's ability to enforce social distancing and face coverings. We're not talking about a minor infection. We're talking about a virus and potential death. I love my job, but that's not a risk I'm willing to take.
1 0.329	6	I am concerned as to who will manage the detailed protocals to clean the buildings, classrooms and offices? Will the Morgan Housekeepnig Department or a professional sanitation company do the cleaning? I am concerned as to how the sanitation will be maintained once we return? How will employees and students be trained to maintain a safe environment?
1 0.329	6	I am considered high risk because of my age and that I am asthmatic. Because we are fighting a dangerous disease that has no cure and seems to have no boundaries, I would prefer waiting for a vaccine.
1 0.329	6	I am in an at risk category with preexisting lung conditions. As a high risk staff member, I am concerned about the spikes of COVID-19 during flu season which will occur Fall 2020 since the virus is tracking with the flu. I have been able to effectively perform my duties while remote. Since Covid-19 has been detrimental to the African-American Community, there needs to be special consideration on how exactly this will be handled since the majority of our MOrgan Community is African-American. There has not been clarity on how buildings will be sanitized, how staff will be protected or procedures in case there is an active case on campus. If a case is found, will the student's courses need to be quarantined? Will Faculty need to be quarantined? There is a concern for major student complaints if rooms are not guaranteed, classes moving online only. Students have been concerned about returning to campus and if there will be a tuition discount and are not wanting to take courses online. Clear communication to the students should be made as soon as possible regarding

		housing and how rooms etc will be granted. Students are also concerned about the winter minimester etc and taking additional courses.
1	0.32%	I am in an very old building, water and other building issues
1	0.32%	I am in the age category where I am susceptable to the virus and would be concerned because of the daily interaction with students.
1	0.32%	I am in the at risk age and I have underlying health concerns. My major concern is sanitizing buildings. Without a vaccine and proper testing I am uncomfortable working on campus.
1	0.32%	I am in the high risk group. I'd like to know and be assured that we will be getting professional cleaning, not just our on-campus housekeeping.
1	0.32%	I am not comfortable sitting at a desk with a mask on for 8 hours on a daily basis.
1	0.32%	I am not confident that everyone will adhere to the policies that will be put in place.
1	0.32%	I am not sure how often those things will be done and if the population as a whole would comply
1	0.32%	I am not sure if I would be able to work comfortably wearing a mask all day. Also, the scent of cleaning supplies may trigger my migraines. If necessary, I am willing to try.
1	0.32%	I am okay with going back if it's not a choice for everyone. I am in my 20s, and I have underline health conditions. I will be risking my life similar to anyone above 65 with health conditions because of my compromised immune system.
1	0.32%	I am one that has underlying respiratory issues and am very concerned about my contracting the virus due to other individuals not taking this pandemic seriously.
1	0.32%	I am over 50 with some pre-existing conditions as identified by the CDC as higher risk for Covid-19
1	0.32%	I am over 60 and being inside with other people for 8 hours a day is a frightening thought.
1	0.32%	I am over 60 years of age with a pre-existing illness (Diabetes). Without a vaccine and proper testing, I remain afraid as we do not know when someone has COVID-19 and does not exhibit any symptoms.
1	0.32%	I am over sixty and have an underline condition.
1	0.32%	I am part of the vulnerable population.
1	0.32%	I am personally classified as high risk
1	0.32%	I am sure what measures the University is planning to take to insure employee safety. If it comes down to how much financial support the University is willing to release. That becomes a concern for me if it does not meet the level of support other major Universities have put in place.
1	0.32%	I am uncertain if the extra cleaning will make me feel safe because the way regular cleaning is being performed. The bathroom toilets are stained with buildup, walls aren't wiped, trash cans are filthy and never washed, new trash bags not being replaced only emptied and left with old food in the bag. Floors are not being vacummed often, windows never cleaned and the desks are not dusted. The old radiator unit has roaches and years of greese and grime with no filter because the company stops making the filter for the old unit. I am not convinced with some of these current issues, that "extra" cleaning will make much of a difference because the same housekeepers will most likely be doing the extra cleaning.
1	0.32%	I am uncertain what percentage of people would follow the rules.
1	0.32%	I am unsure because I do not know exactly what the protocol will be or how that will look and operate in my work place environment.
1	0.32%	I am unsure because of the conditions in the building where my office is placed.
1	0.32%	I am unsure because the consistency of sterilizing the University is a concern
1	0.32%	I am unsure because we haven't heard concrete evidence that a SUSTAINED decline in the number of covid-19 cases has occurred. We've only been told that MD is moving in the right direction, but nothing concrete that says we are out of the woods. With the mass rush to reopen, there could be a surge. Personally, I would prefer that we get a few weeks of documented decline in the number of new cases in the state of MD.
1	0.32%	I am worried about bringing people together again in mass without a vaccine available.
1	0.32%	I am worried we might have a spike even before the beginning of the fall semster.
1	0.32%	I appreciate any safety measures put in place, but ultimately my comfort level will depend on if the virus begins to spread on campus or not. If staff, faculty, and/or students are still catching the virus with the measures in place, I will not feel comfortable.
1	0.32%	I believe that an attempt to stick by the changes would be intended, but I truly find it difficult to believe that the changes would be followed. I have already experienced new policy not

		being followed.
1 0.3	32%	I believe that things are moving to fast and that it will be another outbreak. I'm high risk and need to take every precaution to not be exposed.
1 0.3	32%	I believe that we should have more contactless procedures to minimize exposure to in addition to the social distancing and mask options. As a University, we should promote more communication via email and google meetings than in-person contact.
1 0.3	32%	I can do 100% of my work from home now that we all have remote desktop access. I am not comfortable returning until there is a vaccine for COVID-19 or we have enough information on the virus to determine the way to safely combat/avoid contracting it. Additionally, I would not allow my children to return to school until this time as well, and someone needs to be available to be home with them.
1 0.3	32%	I come directly into contact with students. I would feel comfortable if there was a glass partition between us.
1 0.3	32%	I complained about my workspace before COVID19 and the problems I experienced would be the same, unless those issues are resolved.
1 0.3	32%	I do not feel the campus is sanitary enough.
1 0.3	32%	I do not know the specifics of this protocol (ex: company being used to sanitize the campus) some buildings are already questionable when it comes to cleanliness. Compounded with the various populations on campus coming from different locations, I would feel safe knowing more details about the protocols being used to keep the students and employees safe.
1 0.3	32%	I do not want to risk exposing my family member who is immunocompromised to COVID 19.
1 0.3	32%	I don't believe its feasible for all employees to follow the protocols 100% correctly and 100% if the time. I do not feel safe being in the building for 9 hours a day, 5 days a week. Personally, I believe it is unnecessary to those who are able to carry out duties effectively at home/remotely. Even once we arrive to a point where staff return to campus, there should be an alternation of work days per office (a day, b day) to reduce contact.
1 0.3	32%	I don't believe the building I work in stays clean now. It can become a high traffic area and we could do a better job with limiting the number of people that walk through.
1 0.3	32%	I don't believe they can keep up with cleaning, social distancing, and ensuring my safety from others who don't care.
1 0.3	32%	I don't feel as if these protocols will be enforced properly. Previously to the pandemic, we had to beg for our offices to be vacuumed more than just a quarter. They were dead bugs (roaches specifically) all over our hallways. Edit: Watching the Admitted Students Day event on the university's instagram account and it shows people on campus without masks in close proximity. This just further proves my point of protocols will not be enforced properly.
1 0.3	32%	I don't think the type of regular necessary will be done housekeeping was below standard before Covid 19 I don't think student and some employees will comply with wearing mask and social distancing.
1 0.3	32%	I don't think it's realistic or feasible that sufficient cleaning can be done with students, staff, and faculty on campus that will mitigate the spread of the virus. I hope I am wrong.
1 0.3	32%	I feel comfortable with wearing a mask, gloves and even social distancing. My issue would be with how well my building is cleaned, as well as sanitized due to previous experiences and lack of cleaning.
1 0.3	32%	I feel it's not safe with surrounded by many people in the workplace. There is a chance of getting sick. As everyone takes precautions and one gets sick, and it will affect other people on the campus. There is still no vaccine developed, and people will be scared to risk them, and their family lives.

1 0.3	32%	I have a number of COVID-19 related health factors, placing me in the "very high risk category". I would feel most comfortable continuing telework, and possibly coming to work if required and under the conditions listed in question1.
1 0.3	32%	I have a young child and my concern has more to do with her safety. The type of work that I do would be unrealistic to be able to continue using social distancing. I would feel more comfortable continuing teleworking until more clear information is available about protecting ourselves from COVID-19.

1	0.32%	I live with someone with a compromised immunity system and fear contracting the virus and giving it to him. Even with the extra precautions, I fear that repeated contact with students, faculty or staff may allow me to be in contact with someone who may have been exposed to the virus. Without a proven vaccine, I don't want expose myself or family member. Also, I have to take in consideration that not all will be consistent with necessary precautions at all times.
1	0.32%	I need to understand the details of the protocols in order to answer this question definitively. I live with immuno-compromised people, so I have to ensure that I am not putting them at unnecessary risk.
